Ron has extensive experience in city government and public service. He was elected mayor of Butte Falls, Oregon and served over 20 years in that position. During his tenure he gained funding for and oversaw the installation of a new sewage system and wastewater treatment plant. He also led the town through the challenge of installing a new water system and started a city-owned water company, selling spring water to larger bottling companies, while using the proceeds to better the life of the Town residents.
